



# The Sounds of Nature



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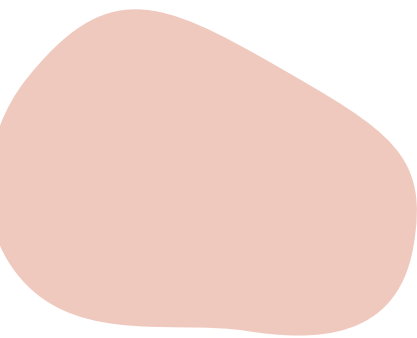
During this route around the estate, practically without noticing, you've probably been accompanied by some sweet melodies. The whistle of the goldfinch or the European serin, the almost burlesque song of the common great tit, the seductive song of the blackbird or the scream of the heron.

These are the sounds of nature. We need to listen, to stop in silence for a few minutes, and let ourselves be carried away by each of the songs. We'll see how to tell the difference between them, some deeper, some sharper, some faster and others slower or intermittent. In this way, we can identify the species that inhabit our fields and forests, without being seen by them.

Bird hides allow us to see without being seen, and to see those species that we've heard singing just a moment ago.

Attracted by the water, the birds that we'll see will be different species and we can tell them apart by the colours of their feathers, their size, the shape of their beaks, or other physiological details.

**Observe carefully and quietly and you will learn a lot!**



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
